

ANKER REFERENCE VALUE ANNUAL UPDATE 20231

RURAL PERU

LIVING WAGE

PEN 1,960 (USD 537)

This report updates the Anker Living Wage Reference Value for rural Peru to 2023. This was PEN 1,455 (USD 434) for 2020 in the original report², comprised of a Net Living Wage of PEN 1,266 (USD 378), plus a social security contribution of PEN 189 (USD 56). The updated Anker Gross Living Wage for 2023 is PEN 1,960 (USD 537) per month, comprised of a Net Living Wage of PEN 1,529 (USD 419), plus social security contribution of PEN 431 (USD 118). Inflation in this period was 20.8%³ and it increased the Net Living Wage. Without accounting for inflation, the Living Wage estimated in 2020 would not be sufficient for families to have a basic but decent standard of living in 2023, because the purchasing power of the Living Wage would have decreased. Social security contributions were calculated using the most up-to-date laws⁴.
